

NORTHERN KETTLE MORaine STATE FOREST HORSE TRAILS

Northern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association

GENERAL INFORMATION

Horse Trails – 41 miles of trails, open late April through November. The main linear trail is 33.3 miles long.

Camping – New Prospect Horseriders Campground is centrally located next to the bridge trail and has 22 family sites with electrical hookups, picnic shelter, 3 group sites, drinking water, pit toilets, and a 24 box stall horse shelter. Campers must register prior to set up. Campground open early May through late October

Vehicle Admission Stickers – All vehicles in designated use areas must have a state park sticker.

Trail Passes – All horse riders age 16 years or older are required to purchase and carry a valid state trail pass while using designated horse trails.

Pets – Pets are permitted in the campground and on most forest trails but must be on a leash no longer than 8 feet and under control at all times. Buildings and picnic areas are off limits to pets except disability service animals.

Hunting – Approximately 95% of the state forest is open to public hunting during established seasons. All trail users are encouraged to wear blaze orange or bright colored clothing during hunting season.

Emergency Information – In case of life-threatening emergency, call 911. For non-life-threatening emergency contact the DNR at the numbers below or sheriff department.

ROAD SIGNS identifying the road the trail crosses are located on the left at most crossings.

MILEAGE MARKERS are positioned every mile along the main trail starting from the south by Hwy H. "Mile 1" is 1 mile north of Hwy H; "Mile 26" is 26 miles north of H, etc.
